
































NO. I'M NOT LISTENING TO THE VOICE IN MY HEAD ANYMORE.

























The main theme of Chapter/Issue #2 was something I needed for myself to express, and it divided some of the creators based on where the story turned. Many things in my life tried to drive me to live on the run. Rather than run, I faced institutionalization. Many times, against my will. In most renegade stories, the main character is always trying to stay ahead of capture, if purused by the law. For me, I was too afraid to run, but also unwilling, because I didn't want to have to. I don't want to be seen as a villain for having an abstract mind.

Society is not like how it was when I was growing up. Life seems more synthetic now. I think nature is under threat, and that dark forces are trying to exile nature from man. In childhood and into my teens, life felt more dream-like. I think the way that society is set up, the dream-like quality of nature is being siphoned. And humans care less that it is.

There is another tale that I wrote which is more meant to chronicle and piece together series of events in my life that were thematically abstract. Many things in my life are similar to a Terry Gilliam movie. This tale was originally meant to piece together themes from my perspective, but also what the 2000-teens were building up to, from a symbolic zeitgeist.

In 1999, 'The Matrix' Series was revealed to the world. This was before 9/11. I felt challenged by the series when trying to originate my own concepts. When I realized that Neo's dream never ended, even after escaping the Matrix, I saw that technology is really just a part of the dream. If we do live in a simulation, it had to be designed and dreamt up by some mind. So, whether this is all an algorithm or not, it's still an aspect of a dream somewhere. Whether my theories about my imagination having greater meaning than the syntax and protocols of this world, I still believe that imagination is what is part of the soul. Comprehension of any abstract idea goes beyond physiology.

I believe there is a conspiracy to fear depth, and assume that in adulthood, depth is only sexual. I may seem in denial, and if so, I would rather live in denial, then accept fearing nothingness. We are being made to believe that this life is all there is, and that it must be adhered to. I would rather be an object of hatred, then limit the potential I can when creating art.

Most of the images in this book were hand drawn by pencil on paper. The point is to prove that there is greater truth taking place than what is allowed. Whether my sexuality played a part in understanding depth within my soul, I still had to spend a lifetime developing a skill where I can replicate images from my imagination onto paper with my hands and mind simultaneously. Artistry is what magic originally was, and only within the last 20 years has it slowly been demonized. There may be evidence of its demonization prior, but artful crafts were considered honorable and useful within society not that long ago.
